Financial Support for Families

Warrnambool College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund -
The government has provided the Camps, Sports & Excursions Funding (CSEF) of \$400 per child for any eligible families. Please ensure you apply for this funding through the school by clicking on this link for the form and details. Applications usually close at the end of term 2.

- Payment Plans are available for families to set up in Compass. This allows for a staged payment plan for items other than Extra Curricular items which are required to be paid in advance. We have the option of either fortnightly or monthly payments, please contact Katie in admin for support.
- State Schools Relief - State Schools' Relief provides support to any Victorian student attending a government school (primary, secondary or specialist) provided they have received CSEF in the previous year. Parents are to lodge the form with their school. For further support, schools are able to submit an application directly, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
